- 1. National Teachers' Day 2022:** Teachers' Day or Shikshak Divas marks the birthday of the country's first Vice President (1952–1962) who went on to become the second President of India (1962-1967), a scholar, philosopher, Bharat Ratna awardee, Dr Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan. He was born on September 5 in the year 1888. But teachers' day was first observed in the year 1962 on his 77th birthday. He was a teacher who turned out to be a philosopher, scholar and politician. He dedicated his entire life to working towards the importance of education in people's lives. The theme for this year's teachers' day is 'Leading in crisis, reimagining the future.'
- 2. International Day of Charity observed on 5th September:** The International Day of Charity is observed on September 5. On this day, philanthropic and humanitarian efforts of any kind are honoured. September 5 was chosen to celebrate the day because it is Mother Teresa's death anniversary. She devoted her life for charity and helping people in need. Her compassion and giving nature had made her a revered figure worldwide. Mother Teresa received the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979 for "work undertaken in the struggle to overcome poverty and distress, which also constitute a threat to peace."
- 3. Government of India approve celebrating "Hyderabad Liberation Day" all year long:** Hyderabad Liberation Day: The Government of India approved annual commemoration of "Hyderabad Liberation Day " for the years 2022 to 2023. On September 17, 2022, the Ministry of Culture will organise the inaugural event for the year-long celebration of Hyderabad Liberation Day. The goal is to raise awareness of the tale of sacrifice, heroism, and resistance among the current generation in India as a whole as well as in the region under study. After India gained independence, the Nizam of Hyderabad resisted the idea of joining India and intended to maintain his independence. The last Nizam of Hyderabad's princely state, Osman Ali Khan Asaf Jah VII, was offered to join India in 1947 but turned it down. India chose the term "Operation Polo" for their decision to conquer Hyderabad. The operation was done under the guidance of Sardar Patel. Hyderabad was taken into India by Police action on September 13, 1948. The Indian Army and Police took Hyderabad under their control and completely incorporated it into Indian territory in a five-day campaign by soundly beating Nizam.
- 4. International Day of Clean Air for blue skies: 7th September:** The International Day of Clean Air for blue skies is observed globally on September 07 to promote and facilitate actions to improve air quality. It focuses on the transboundary nature of air pollution highlighting the need for collective accountability and collective action. This year's theme of "The Air We Share"

- 5. International Literacy Day 2022 celebrates on 08th September:** International Literacy Day (ILD) is celebrated on 8 September every year all across the globe to make people aware of the meaning and importance of literacy for individuals and societies. This year's International Literacy Day will be celebrated worldwide under the theme, "Transforming Literacy Learning Spaces" and will be an opportunity to rethink the fundamental importance of literacy learning spaces to build resilience and ensure quality, equitable, and inclusive education for all.
- 6. International Day to Protect Education from Attack: 09th September:** The International Day to Protect Education from Attack is an international observance established by a unanimous decision of the United Nations General Assembly in 2020. It is observed on September 9 of each year.
- 7. World EV Day 2022: World EV Day 2022 is observed on the 9th of September.** World EV Day is observed to emphasize the importance of e-mobility. World EV day helps to spread awareness about sustainable transport facilities to the people. Air pollution is mainly caused by transportation, and EVs are one of the major alternatives to decrease air pollution. The first World EV Day was observed in 2020 and was an initiative of Sustainability Media Company Greet TV. Every year, World EV Day is observed on 9th September 2022.
- 8. Himalaya Diwas 2022:** The National Mission for Clean Ganga organized Himalayan Diwas on September 09, in association with Naula Foundation. The day is celebrated with an aim to preserve the Himalayan ecosystem and region. This day is celebrated to mark the importance of the Himalayas. Himalaya Day 2022 was observed under the theme 'Himalayas will be safe only when the interests of its residents are protected. On August 12, 2011, the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) was listed as a society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The consortium acts as the implementation arm of the National Ganga River Basin Authority (NGRBA), which was constituted under provisions of the Environment Protection Act (EPA), 1986.
- 9. World Suicide Prevention Day observed on 10th September:** World Suicide Prevention Day (WSPD), celebrated annually on 10 September, is organized by the International Association for Suicide Prevention (IASP) and endorsed by the World Health Organization (WHO). The theme of WSPD 2022, "Creating hope through action," reflects the need for collective, action to address this urgent public health issue.
- 10. National Forest Martyrs Day 2022 observed on 11th September:** National Forest Martyrs Day is observed on September 11 to pay tribute to those who sacrificed their lives to protect forests and wildlife. The observance of the National Forest Martyrs is marked by several events aimed at creating awareness about protecting forests and the environment at large. National Forest

Martyrs Day commemorates the importance of trees. To live healthy lives, we must conserve the forests and protect the trees.

- 11. India To Emerge As 3rd Largest Economy Of World By 2029: India is set to become the third largest economy in the world by 2029.** A State Bank of India report said India will surpass Germany in 2027 and most likely Japan by 2029 at the current rate of growth. The report said that the country has undergone a large structural shift since 2014 and is now the 5th largest economy overtaking the United Kingdom. The research report from SBI's Economic Research Department highlighted that Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth rate for FY23 is estimated between 6.7-7.7 per cent.
- 12. Dubai hosts the first Homeopathy International Health summit: The first Homeopathy International Health summit** hosted by Dubai aimed to teach and promote a homeopathic system of medicine, medications, and practices. Ashwini Kumar Choubey, Minister of State for Environment, Forestry, and Climate Change, virtually addressed the meeting.
- 13. CCRAS 'SPARK' Program to Support Innovative Research in Ayurveda:** The Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences (CCRAS) takes a unique initiative to support the research efforts of the upcoming bright mind of India. CCRAS has developed the Studentship Program for Ayurveda Research Ken (SPARK) for Ayurveda students (BAMS) in recognized Ayurveda colleges. SPARK Program has been developed by the CCRAS to support the young minds of the students and to promote the culture of evidence-based scientific research in the field of Ayurveda.
- 14. Leh in Ladakh all set to Host First-Ever Mountain Bicycle World Cup:** Leh is all set to host the first-ever Mountain Bicycle, MTB, World Cup- the 'UCI MTB Eliminator World Cup in India. The 'UCI MTB Eliminator World Cup' will be organized in collaboration with the Administration of Union Territory of Ladakh and the Cycling Association of India. The Ladakh leg of the Eliminator World Cup is part of ten professional race series held in various cities across the world.
- 15. Nation first-ever "Night Sky Sanctuary" to be set up in Ladakh:** India's first-ever 'night sky sanctuary' will be set up within the next three months in Hanle, Ladakh, Union Minister of Science and Technology, Jitendra Singh. This is a unique and first-of-its-kind initiative by the Indian government. The proposed dark sky reserve will be located at Hanle, Ladakh, and will boost astro-tourism in India, according to a statement released by the Union Ministry of Science and Technology. The night sky sanctuary will be set up as part of the Changthang Wildlife Sanctuary, the world's second-largest nature reserve.
- 16. 36th National Games: Mascot and Anthem Launched by Amit Shah:** Union Home Minister Amit Shah has launched the mascot and the anthem for the 36th National Games at Trans Stadia in Ahmedabad. The mascot is named 'Savaj' which means cub in Gujarati. The anthem for the national games is based on the theme of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat'. The National Games are going to be organized from 29th September 2022 to 12th October 2022. It will be

played in six cities of Gujarat including, Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, Surat, Vadodara, Rajkot, and Bhavnagar.

- 17. Liz Truss: 3rd female Prime Minister of United Kingdom:** Liz Truss: Mary Elizabeth Truss, a British politician who was born on July 26, 1975, is now the leader of the Conservative Party and is slated to become prime minister of the UK on September 6, 2022.
- 18. Gov announces to rename the Rajpath as Kartavya Path: The government of India has announced to change the name of Rajpath and Central Vista lawns into Kartavya Path.** The decision is said to shed remnants of the British colony in India. The decision came after a special meeting on September 7, convened with the aim of renaming the Rajpath and Central Vista lawns. Earlier, the Modi government had changed the name of the road on which the Prime Minister's residence is, from Race Course Road to Lok Kalyan Marg.
- 19. 19) Grievance Redressal Index 2022: UIDAI topped in August 2022:** Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) has topped among all Ministries/Departments for resolving Public Grievances in the ranking. The report was published by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG). In a statement released by the Ministry of Electronics and IT, it is stated that UIDAI is further committed in serving the people of India and has been a catalyst for both ease of living and business. **Founded: 28 January 2009; UIDAI Headquarters: New Delhi.**
- 20. SC Judge DY Chandrachud named as new Chairman of NALSA:** Supreme Court judge Justice DY Chandrachud has been appointed as the next executive chairperson of the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA). The post was previously held by the Chief Justice of India UU Lalit. President Droupadi Murmu has appointed Justice D.Y. Chandrachud as the executive chairman of the NALSA. The NALSA has been constituted under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 to provide free Legal Services to the weaker sections of the society. Its purpose is to provide free legal services to eligible candidates, and to organize Lok Adalats for the speedy resolution of cases.
- 21. President Droupadi Murmu confers National Awards to distinguished teachers:** On the occasion of Teachers Day, President Droupadi Murmu has honoured 45 selected teachers from across the country with National Awards at Vigyan Bhawan New Delhi. India is celebrating its 50th National Teachers' Day. The day is celebrated on September 5 every year which is the birth anniversary of India's second President Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, who was also a scholar, philosopher, and Bharat Ratna awardee.
- 22. Tripura sets up the India's first Bio-Villages:** Tripura becomes the first state in India to have the first modified bio-village. The Daspara village of Tripura is converted into a nature-based lifestyle and livelihood and reduced the use of chemical fertilizers. Dasapara is a home for 64 families which depends on agriculture and fishery. Tripura Government has aimed to set up a total of 100 bio villages in the state. 10 bio villages are completed, and the first bio village has

been set up at Dasapara in Charilam constituency of Sepahijala district. The project supports the development of solar-powered agricultural equipment, energy-saving electrical devices, biogas, and biofertilizers at the local level.

- 23. PM Narendra Modi announced PM-SHRI Scheme for upgrading 14500 school:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi has announced a new initiative, the development and upgradation of 14 thousand 500 schools across the country under the Pradhan Mantri Schools For Rising India (PM-SHRI) Yojana. PM-SHRI schools will become model schools which will encapsulate the full spirit of the National Education Policy. The centrally sponsored scheme will be implemented by strengthening existing schools selected from amongst those managed by the Central government, states, Union Territories and local bodies.
- 24. NITI Aayog: Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat Top States In Implementing Poshan Abhiyaan scheme:** Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh and Gujarat have been ranked as the top three states among larger states in terms of the overall implementation of the Centre's flagship Poshan Abhiyaan, according to a Niti Aayog report. Sikkim was the best performer among the small states. The report titled 'Preserving Progress on Nutrition in India: Poshan Abhiyan in Pandemic Times' further said that 12 out of 19 large states had an implementation score of over 70 per cent. While Dadar and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu topped among Union Territories (UTs), Punjab and Bihar were the lowest performers among larger states in terms of the overall implementation of Poshan Abhiyaan, as per the government think tank report.
- 25. Digital India Mission: Uttar Pradesh Tops in Use of e-Prosecution Portal:** Uttar Pradesh, with 9.12 million cases, ranks at the top in the number of disposal and entry of cases through the e-Prosecution portal managed by the Union government under its Digital India Mission. According to the figures till the end of August, Madhya Pradesh followed in second spot at 2.31 million, Bihar with 859,000, Gujarat with 487,000 and Chhattisgarh with 383,000 cases. UP also ranks at the top in disposal of online cases on this portal, with about 470,000 entries, followed by 170,000 for MP and 125,000 for Gujarat.
- 26. West Bengal bags International Travel Award 2023 For 'Best Destination for Culture':** West Bengal has been accredited the International Travel Award 2023 for Best Destination for Culture by the Pacific Area Travel Writers Association (PATWA), an affiliate member of the United Nations World Tourism Organization (UNWTO). The award will be presented at the World Tourism and Aviation Leaders' Summit in Berlin, Germany, on March 9, 2023.
- 27. Ministry of Education launches Shikshak Parv to advance NEP:** Ministry of Education launches Shikshak Parv: Shikshak Parv was launched by Union Ministers Annapurna Devi and Rajkumar Ranjan Singh to honour teachers and advance the new National Education Policy (NEP). An inaugural colloquium hosted by the Ministry of Education, CBSE, AICTE, and the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship marked the beginning of Shikshak Parv.

- 28. President Droupadi Murmu to launch 'TB Mukta Bharat Abhiyaan':** President Draupadi Murmu will launch the Pradhan Mantri TB Mukta Bharat Abhiyaan virtually on 9th September 2022. The Pradhan Mantri TB Mukta Bharat Abhiyaan aims to eliminate tuberculosis from India by 2025. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has given a distinctive call to end TB in India giving years ahead of the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) of 2030.
- 29. 3 Indian cities join UNESCO network of learning cities: Warangal and two cities from Kerala have joined the UNESCO Global Network of Learning Cities (GNLC)** in recognition of their outstanding efforts to make lifelong learning a reality for all at the local level. Warangal in Telangana, Thrissur and Nilambur are among the 77 cities from 44 countries which have joined this network of the world body. UNESCO GNLC is an international network consisting of cities that successfully promote lifelong learning across their communities. It includes 294 cities from all around the world that share inspiration, know-how and best practice among each other, the world body.
- 30. UNDP's human development index: India ranks 132 out of 191 countries:** A report on the 2021 Human Development Index (HDI) is part of the Human Development Report 2021-2022 released by the United Nations Development Programme. The HDI measures the average achievement of a country in three basic dimensions of human development — a long and healthy life, education and a decent standard of living. It is calculated using four indicators — life expectancy at birth, mean years of schooling, expected years of schooling, and the Gross National Income (GNI) per capita. India's latest HDI value of 0.633 places the country in the medium human development category, lower than its value of 0.645 in the 2020 report. India scored 0.123 in the Multi-Dimensional Poverty Index (MPI) with a headcount ratio of 27.9 per cent. Among India's neighbours, Sri Lanka (73rd), China (79th), Bangladesh (129th), and Bhutan (127th) are ranked above India, while Pakistan (161st), Nepal (143rd), and Myanmar (149th) are worse off.
- 31. Diamond League 2022 Finals: Neeraj Chopra win with a throw of 88.44m:** Diamond League 2022 Finals: Neeraj Chopra gained another accomplishment when he won the Diamond League Final in Zurich. Neeraj Chopra has now won the Diamond League Trophy, making him the first Indian to do it. The expert javelin thrower recorded a throw of 88.44 metres on his second attempt, which was sufficient for him to win the competition.

- 32. Rajasthan launched 100 days urban employment guarantee scheme:** Rajasthan government launched an ambitious scheme to provide 100 days of employment to needy families in urban areas on the lines of the rural employment guarantee scheme MGNREGA. More than 2.25 lakh families have already registered for the Indira Gandhi Urban Employment Scheme which was proposed by chief minister Ashok Gehlot in the state budget this year.
- 33. HDFC Bank unveils 'Bank on Wheels' in Gujarat:** HDFC Bank has unveiled its state-of-the-art 'Bank on Wheel' van in Gujarat. The Bank in Wheel van service will take banking services to unbanked villages. The Bank in Wheel van will visit remote villages located 10-25 km from the nearest branch to further financial inclusion, under the HDFC Bank's newly initiated Rural Banking Business. The Bank in Wheel initiative is a part of a pilot project to offer banking services in unbanked locations. Customers can access 21 banking products as well as services. The Bank in Wheel van will be operational at each location for a specific period and will cover 3 villages in a day.
- 34. DRDO & Indian Army Successfully Conduct Six Flight-Tests of QRSAM Off Odisha Coast:** Defense Research and Development Organization (DRDO) and the Indian Army completed six flight tests of the Quick Reaction Surface to Air Missile (QRSAM) system from Integrated Test Range (ITR), Chandipur, on the Odisha Coast, as part of evaluation trials. QRSAM is a short-range Surface Air Missile (SAM) system, which is designed and developed by the DRDO. The QRSAM aims to provide a protective shield to the moving armored columns of the Army from aerial attacks. The six flight tests were carried out against high-speed aerial targets mimicking various types of threats to evaluate the capability of the QRSAM as a short-range Surface Air Missile (SAM) system.
- 35. Fortune India Rich List 2022: Gautam Adani India's richest man:** According to Forbes real-time billionaires list, Asia's richest man Gautam Adani has overtaken Amazon founder Jeff Bezos to become the 3rd richest person in the world. He became India's richest man with a net worth of USD 129.16 billion (Rs. 10.29 trillion) Meanwhile, Reliance Industries chairman Mukesh Ambani's net worth stands at USD 94 billion becoming the 8th richest in the world and the 2nd richest in India.
- 36. E-FAST- India's first National Electric Freight Platform Launched by NITI Aayog, WRI:** NITI Aayog and World Resources Institute (WRI), launched India's first National Electric Freight Platform- E-FAST India (Electric Freight Accelerator for Sustainable Transport-India). The National Electric Freight Platform brings different stakeholders together with the support of the World Economic Forum, CALSTART, and RMI India. The platform aims to raise awareness of freight electrification bolstered by an on-ground demonstration pilot and evidence-based research. It will support scalable pilots and inform policies aimed at accelerating freight electrification in India.

- 37. Odisha govt launched rainwater harvesting scheme named 'CHHATA':** Odisha government has launched a rainwater harvesting scheme named 'Community Harnessing and Harvesting Rainwater Artificially from Terrace to Aquifer (CHHATA). The new scheme was approved by the Cabinet last month. It will be implemented for a period of five years. **Capital: Bhubaneswar, Chief Minister: Naveen Patnaik, Governor: Ganeshi Lal.**
- 38. Bihar CM inaugurated India's longest rubber dam on Falgu River:** Bihar Chief Minister, Nitish Kumar has inaugurated India's longest rubber dam 'Gayaji Dam' on the Falgu River in Gaya. The dam has been built at an estimated cost of Rs 324 crore. Experts from IIT (Roorkee) were involved with the project. There will be enough water in the dam round the year for the convenience of pilgrims.
- 39. World First Aid Day 2022: "Lifelong First Aid":** World First Aid Day is celebrated every year on the second Saturday of September. This year, World First Aid Day 2022 falls on 10 September 2022. The day is recognized worldwide to promote the significance of first aid, which is an important fundamental skill, and to create awareness on a global level about how it can save precious lives. The day was introduced first by the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC).
- 40. Hindi Diwas 2022: Hindi Diwas or Hindi Day is observed every year on 14 September to mark the popularity of Hindi as an official language of India.** The language was adopted under Article 343 of the Indian Constitution. The first Hindi day was celebrated on 14th September 1953. Hindi is one of the major languages used in India as a large portion of the country's population knows and uses the language. Hindi language is written in Devnagiri script and is a descendant of Sanskrit. we observe World Hindi Day on January 10, the National Hindi Diwas is celebrated on September 14. The Constituent Assembly of India had espoused Hindi as India's official language on 14 September, 1949.
- 41. National Engineer's Day 2022 celebrated on 15 September :In India, Engineer's Day is celebrated on September 15 every year.** The day is celebrated to recognise the contribution of engineers in the development of the nation. This day commemorates the birth anniversary of Sir Moksha Gundam Visvesvaraya, who is considered one of the greatest engineers of India.
- 42. International Day of Democracy 2022 observed on 15 September: This year, September 15 marks the 15th anniversary of the International Day of Democracy.** The day is celebrated annually around the world to strengthen democracies and highlight its values and principles. This year, the day is focused on the "importance of media freedom to democracy, peace, and delivering on the Sustainable Development Goals".
- 43. World Lymphoma Awareness Day observed on 15 September : World Lymphoma Awareness Day (WLAD) is held on September 15 every year and is a day dedicated to raising awareness of lymphoma, an increasingly common form of cancer.** It is a global initiative hosted by the Lymphoma Coalition. Lymphoma is a cancer of the lymphatic system, which is part of the body's germ-fighting network. The lymphatic system includes the lymph nodes (lymph glands), spleen, thymus gland and bone marrow.

- 44. International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer 2022: 16th September ::World Ozone Day or the** International Day for the preservation of the Ozone Layer is observed on the 16th of September. The day aims to create awareness about the importance and need of the Ozone layer which is the single protection on Earth against UV rays coming out from the sun. The theme announced by the UN Environment Programme for International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer 2022 is 'Global Cooperation Protecting Life on Earth'.
- 45. World Patient Safety Day observed on 17 September : World Patient Safety Day is observed every year on 17** September to create awareness about different safety measures that should be taken to ensure patient safety. The day focuses on preventing and reducing risks, errors, and harm that patients face. This year, the theme of World Patient Safety Day 2022 is 'Medication Safety' along with the slogan 'Medication Without Harm' with a call to action to 'Know, Check & Ask'. Medication errors and unsafe medication practices can lead to severe patient harm, disabilities, and deaths.
- 46. PM Modi To Attend SCO Meeting With Putin And Xi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi is all set to travel to Samarkand** in Uzbekistan for the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation summit on September 15 and 16. This will be the first in-person summit after June 2019 when the SCO summit was held in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan. The Prime Minister, sources said, is likely to reach Samarkand on September 14 and return on September 16. Delhi will hold the presidency of the grouping for a year until September 2023. So, next year, India will host the SCO summit which will be attended, among others, by leaders of China, Russia, Pakistan. The Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) is a permanent intergovernmental international organisation, created on 15 June 2001 in Shanghai (China).
- 47. Chief Justice of India with the shortest tenure, Kamal Narain Singh passes away: Former Chief Justice of India** Kamal Narain Singh passed away, at the age of 95. Justice Narain had a tenure of only 17 days as the CJI, making him the chief justice with the shortest tenure. He was the 22nd Chief Justice of India, with a term from November 25, 1991, to December 12, 1991.
- 48. SETU programme introduced in the US by Piyush Goyal : SETU programme: To connect entrepreneurs in India** with US-based investors, the commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal has created a programme called SETU (Supporting Entrepreneurs in Transformation and Upskilling). With SETU, mentors in the US who are eager to support entrepreneurship can connect with Indian firms that are just getting off the ground.
- 49. Agnikul Cosmos secured first patent for 3D-printed rocket engine: Agnikul Cosmos, one of India's private space** startups, has secured its first patent for the design and manufacturing of its 3D-printed rocket engine. Agnilet, one such single-piece engine, is the world's first single-piece 3D printed rocket engine fully designed and manufactured in India. It was successfully test-fired in early 2021. The exercise, conducted over four days, comprised the deployment of attack helicopters as the aerial arm in support of ground forces carrying out drills, practising annihilation of enemy defences and deep penetration. The joint exercise was spearheaded by General Officer Commanding, Kharga Corps, Lt Gen Pratik Sharma. The exercise was also attended by Lt Gen Nav K Khanduri, General Officer Commanding in Chief, Western Command.
- 51. PM Modi Inaugurates World Dairy Summit 2022 in Greater Noida: World Dairy Summit 2022: Prime Minister** Narendra Modi inaugurated the International Dairy Federation's World Dairy Summit (IDF WDS) 2022 at the India Expo Center and Mart in Greater Noida. The four-day IDF WDS 2022 will be held from September 12th to 16th. About 1,500 participants from 50 countries are expected to attend IDF WDS 2022, according to the PMO. The last summit in India was in 1974.
- 52. National Maritime Heritage Complex to be built in Gujarat : Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways is building** the National Maritime Heritage Complex at the historic Indus Valley civilization region of Lothal in Gujarat with a total cost of 3500 crores rupees. The first-of-its-kind complex in India, this centre will showcase India's rich and diverse maritime heritage. The foundation stone for the NMHC project was laid by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the consent for the master plan was given in March 2019.
- 53. Swami Swaroopanand Saraswati passes away at 99 : Dwarka-Sharda Peeth Shankaracharya** Swami Swaroopanand Saraswati has passed away at Narsinghpur in Madhya Pradesh. He was 99 years old. He breathed his last at the Shridham Jhoteswar Ashram in Narsinghpur. Swami Swaroopanand was born in Dighori village in Madhya Pradesh's Siwani district. He left his home at the age of 9. Later, he went to Kashi in Uttar Pradesh, where he gained spiritual enlightenment and religious wisdom from Swami Karpatri Maharaj. Swami Shankracharya was also imprisoned during the Indian Independence movement. He also participated in the Quit India movement launched by Mahatma Gandhi in 1942 .
- 54. HDFC Bank issues India's first Electronic Bank Guarantee: HDFC Bank, India's largest private sector bank,** became the first bank in the country to issue an Electronic Bank Guarantee (e-BG) in partnership with National E-Governance Services Limited (NeSL). The paper-based, time-consuming process has been eliminated with the new electronic bank guarantees that can be processed, stamped, verified and delivered instantly with enhanced security. This is a transformational change, and the Bank will migrate to e-BG to benefit all its customers.
- 55. Ladakh Screenwriters Fair inaugurated by Lieutenant Governor RK Mathur : In Leh, Ladakh** Lieutenant Governor RK Mathur effectively opened the five-day Ladakh Screenwriters Fair. Mr. Mathur claimed that Ladakh technologists and content providers are conversant with the motion

This will be Rohatgi's second time as AG, after his first stint between June 2014 and June 2017. At the end of June this year, AG Venugopal's tenure was extended for a period of three months or "until further orders". This extension is set to expire on September 30.
- 58. Uttar Pradesh tops in India, 8462 lakes developed under Mission Amrit Sarovar: Uttar Pradesh becomes the first** state in India to construct 8,642 Amrit Sarovar (Lakes) in India. Amrit Sarovar is an ambitious mission initiated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, which aims to conserve water for the future. Madhya Pradesh is in the second position, Jammu and Kashmir in third, Rajasthan in fourth, and Tamil Nadu ranked in the fifth position.
- 59. National Defense MSME Conclave and Exhibition begins in Kota, Rajasthan: National Defense MSME Conclave and Exhibition:** The two-day National Defense MSME Conclave and Exhibition begins in Kota, Rajasthan. In the exhibition, defence gear including T-90 and BMP-2 tanks, artillery cannons, numerous sniper and machine gun types, and military bridges are on display. Start-ups and MSMEs are also showcasing their products, as are young people innovating in the defence sector. The event will feature participation from more than 50 defense-related businesses, startups, and MSMEs.
- 60. JIMEX 2022: India-Japan joint naval drills in the Bay of Bengal begins: The sixth edition of Japan-India Maritime Exercise 2022 (JIMEX 22),** hosted by the Indian Navy, began in the Bay of Bengal. The Japan Maritime Self Defence Force (JMSDF) ships are being led by Rear Admiral Hirata Toshiyuki, Commander Escort Flotilla Four, and Indian naval ships by Rear Admiral Sanjay Bhalla, Flag Officer Commanding Eastern Fleet. This edition marks the 10th anniversary of JIMEX, which began in Japan in 2012. It also coincides with the 70th anniversary of diplomatic relations between India and Japan.
- 61. Nagaland Holds its First Ever Naga Mircha Festival: The first Naga Mircha Festival was hosted and organized by** the Seiyhama village Council and Seiyhama Naga Mircha Growers. The first Naga Mircha Festival was sponsored by the Department of Horticulture, and it was held at the Village Council Hall. Naga Mircha was also the first product to receive a GI Tag from Nagaland. The Naga chili also known as King Chilli, has developed significantly in the farming sector.

World's largest museum of Harappan culture is coming up in Rakhigarhi, Haryana: Harappan Culture in Haryana:** The world's largest museum of Harappan culture is coming up in Rakhigarhi in Haryana to showcase about 5,000-year-old Indus Valley artefacts. The village of Rakhigarhi was part of the Indus Valley Civilisation from 2600-1900 BC. Haryana is slated to host the world's largest museum dedicated to the Harappan civilization. Rakhigarhi is a hamlet in Haryana's Hisar district, some 150 kilometres from Delhi. The settlement is also a well-known archaeological site from the time of the Indus Valley civilization.
- 63. India launches 'Urban Wastewater Scenario in India' at World Water Congress and Exhibition 2022 :** India has launched Joint Whitepaper on 'Urban Wastewater Scenario in India', with Denmark at World Water Congress and Exhibition 2022 in Copenhagen. The 'Urban Wastewater Scenario in India' was facilitated by Jal Shakti Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat along with Danish Environment Minister Lea Wermelin and Development Co-operation Minister Flemming Moller Mortensen. The Whitepaper is a result of the Indo-Danish Bilateral Green Strategic Partnership, which focuses on green hydrogen, renewable energy, and wastewater management.
- 64. Indore to become the country's first 'Smart City' with 'Smart Addresses':** Indore will create history by implementing a fully digital addressing system, making it the first city in India to do so. The smart city advanced significantly when a memorandum of understanding was signed with the firm Pataa Navigations. Pataa has developed patented technology and is working with the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) to develop a digital addressing system for the nation. The user has the option to record voice instructions, which eliminates the need to repeat the address over the phone and makes it simpler for the guest to find the location. In the future, the user will be able to share a short code rather than sharing their lengthy and whole address with everybody, which is a huge benefit of anything like this.
- 65. Fitch Cuts India's Economic Growth Forecast for FY23 to 7% from Previous Estimate of 7.8% :** Fitch Ratings slashed India's GDP growth projection for FY23 to 7 per cent, saying the economy is expected to slow against the backdrop of the global economy, elevated inflation and high-interest rate. In June, it had forecast 7.8 per cent growth for India. The RBI expects the economy to grow 7.2 per cent in the current fiscal year. We expect the economy to slow given the global economic backdrop, elevated inflation and tighter monetary policy.
- 66. Jharkhand becomes the 3rd state to have Food Security Atlas : Jharkhand has become the third state after Bihar and Odisha in eastern India to have Food Security Atlas for its rural areas.** Odisha and Bihar had their Atlas launched in 2018. Food Security Atlas of Rural Jharkhand 2022' launched in Ranchi. Finance Minister of Jharkhand, Dr Rameshwar Oraon assured that the government would make efforts towards giving quota and green cards to the food insecure districts of Jharkhand. This Atlas is an effort toward mapping the food security situation in the state. It has been prepared by the Delhi-based Institute for Human Development (IHD) as part of the research initiative of the Indira Gandhi Institute of Development Research, Mumbai.`

- 67. India's First Forest University to be Established in Telangana:** India is going to have its first Forest University. The Forestry Universities (UoF) Act 2022 was approved by the Telangana Assembly. The University of Forestry (UoF), will be the first of its kind in India. Globally, it will be the third University of Forestry after Russia and China. The Telangana government has decided to expand the Forestry College and Research Institute (FCRI) in Hyderabad. The FCRI will be turned into a full-fledged University.
- 68. Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park in Darjeeling recognised as best zoo:** The Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park (PNHZP) in West Bengal's Darjeeling has been adjudged the best zoo in the country, while Kolkata's Alipore Zoological Garden has secured the fourth position. There are around 150 zoos across the country. As per the list, the Arignar Anna Zoological Park in Chennai has secured the second position, followed by the Sri Chamarajendra Zoological Gardens in Mysore, Karnataka. Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park (also called the Darjeeling Zoo) is a 67.56-acre (27.3 ha) zoo in the town of Darjeeling in the Indian state of West Bengal. The zoo was opened in 1958.
- 69. India Stands 4th in Global Crypto Adoption Index 2022:** Blockchain analysis platform Chainalysis published its global crypto adoption index for 2022 of nations with the highest cryptocurrency adoption rate with India ranking fourth in the list, two spots down from last year. Chainalysis report noted that the emerging markets dominate the Global Crypto Adoption Index this year. The global index is led by Vietnam for the second consecutive year, Philippines and Ukraine have taken the second and third rankings, respectively.
- 70. Project Cheetah : eight cheetahs have landed in Gwalior from Namibia's capital Windhoek and reintroduced in Kuno National Park.** The day also marks PM Modi's 72nd birthday. Cheetah or *Acinonyx Jubatus*: It is the fastest terrestrial animal on earth. The cheetah is the only large carnivore that got completely wiped out from India, mainly due to over-hunting and habitat loss. Meaning: The word 'Cheetah' is of Sanskrit origin meaning 'variegated', 'adorned' or 'painted'. The country's last spotted cheetah died in Sal forests of Chhattisgarh's Koriya district in 1948 and the wild animal was declared extinct in the country in 1952. Maharaja Ramanuj Pratap Singh, the ruler of a small princely state in today's Chhattisgarh shot India's last 3 surviving cheetahs. 2012: Supreme Court ordered a stay on the reintroduction project. 2020: South African experts visited four potential sites: Kuno-Palpur, Nauradehi Wildlife Sanctuary, Gandhi Sagar Wildlife Sanctuary and Madhav National Park. Project Cheetah: The introduction of cheetahs in India is being done under Project Cheetah, which is the world's first intercontinental large wild carnivore translocation project. Kuno National Park is a national park in MP established in 1981 as a wildlife sanctuary. In 2018, it was given the status of a national park.
- 71. India Ratings Cuts FY23 GDP Growth Forecast to 6.9%:** India Ratings became the latest agency to cut its FY23 gross domestic product forecast. The ratings agency cut the forecast to 6.9 per cent

from 7 per cent, joining other institutions who have cut their projections to below 7 per cent since the release of the April-June quarter GDP data.

- 72. Health Minister Dr Mansukh Mandaviya launched Raktdaan Amrit Mahotsav:** Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya launched a 15-day blood donation drive on the occasion of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's birthday. The blood donation drive is known as 'Raktdaan Amrit Mahotsav' which will continue till 1st October 2022 which is National Voluntary Blood Donation Day.
- 73. Election Commission of India launched BLO e-Patrika:** The Election Commission of India has released a new digital publication 'BLO e-Patrika' at an interactive session held with BLOs spread across the states in India. In states/UTs, 50 BLOs from nearby states of Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, and Delhi joined the event physically at India Habitat Centre in New Delhi. The BLO e-Patrika is released to ensure a cascading information model for a better informed and motivated Booth Level Officer. The themes of the bimonthly e-Patrika include subjects related to EVM-VVPAT Training, IT application, special summary revision, Minimum SVEEP Activities at polling booths, Postal Ballot facilities, accessible elections, Electoral Literacy Clubs, Unique voter awareness initiatives, and National Voters Day.
- 74. International Equal Pay Day celebrates on 18 September : International Equal Pay Day, celebrated on 18 September,** represents the longstanding efforts towards the achievement of equal pay for work of equal value.
- 75. World Bamboo Day 2022 observed on 18th September: World Bamboo Day 2022 is observed on September 18 in** order to raise awareness about the conservation of this extremely useful plant. Conceptualised by the World Bamboo Organisation (WBO), this day also promotes the bamboo industry by highlighting its concerns.
- 76. A book titled "Ambedkar and Modi" released by former President Ram Nath Kovind:** Former President Ram Nath Kovind has launched a book titled 'Ambedkar and Modi: Reformer's Ideas Performer's Implementation'. The book, compiled by Bluekraft Digital Foundation, explores the life and works of Dr BR Ambedkar while drawing a parallel with the initiatives and reforms taken by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to implement the ideals of the social reformer.

Dharmendra Pradhan launched Ramkrishna Mission's Awakening programme:** Union Minister for Education and Skill Development & Entrepreneurial Shri Dharmendra Pradhan launched the Ramkrishna Mission 'Awakening' Program for students of classes I to V. During the occasion, Secretary of the Ramkrishna Mission Swami Shantatmanada, Chairperson CBSE, Smt Nidhi Chibber, and other officials of KVS, NVS, and the Ministry were present. Shri Dharmendra Pradhan said that NEP 2020 is inspired by the philosophy of Swami Vivekananda. - 78. - 79. With this accomplishment, all villages on the Andaman and Nicobar Islands have received the Har Ghar Jal certification and have been verified as ODF plus open defecation free. There are namely three important components of Sujal and Swachh state: (i) safe and secure drinking water supply and management; (ii) ODF Plus: ODF Sustainability and Solid and Liquid Waste Management (SLWM) and (iii) cross-cutting interventions like convergence, IEC, action planning, etc. Andaman and Nicobar Island (UT) Lieutenant Governor: Admiral D K Joshi.
- 80. Varanasi nominated as first-ever SCO Tourism and Cultural Capital for 2022-2023:** Varanasi city has been nominated as the first cultural and tourism capital during 2022-2023 at the 22nd meeting of the SCO council in Samarkand. The 22nd meeting of the SCO council in Samarkand was also attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Various events will also be organized under the framework of a major cultural outreach program in Varanasi during 2032-2023. Swati Piralal is also a recipient of the Padma Shri, one of the highest civilian honours of India.

India takes over SCO rotating presidency and to host SCO summit 2023:** The rotational presidency of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization has been handed over to India in Samarkand, Uzbekistan. Delhi will hold the presidency of the grouping for a year until September 2023. And next year, India will host the SCO summit. In the declaration, it is stated that the presidency of the SCO for the forthcoming period passes to India. The next meeting of the SCO Council of Heads of State will be held in 2023 in India. Launched in Shanghai in June 2001, the SCO has eight full members, including its six founding members, China, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan. India and Pakistan joined as full members in 2017. Iran has been admitted as a permanent member of the SCO at the Samarkand summit.
- 83. PM Narendra Modi launched world's first Cheetah Rehabilitation Project:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi has released wild Cheetahs in Kuno National Park and launched the world's first Cheetah Rehabilitation Project. Cheetahs which have been brought from Namibia are being introduced in India under Project Cheetah, which is the world's first inter-continental large wild carnivore translocation project. The cheetah was declared extinct from India in 1952. The Cheetahs will help restore open forest and grassland ecosystems in India. This effort, in line with the Prime Minister's commitment to environmental protection and wildlife conservation, will also lead to enhanced livelihood opportunities for the local community through eco-development and ecotourism activities.
- 84. India's 1st lithium-ion cell factory inaugurated in Andhra Pradesh : The Minister of State for Electronics and Information Technology, Rajeev Chandrasekhar has launched the pre-production run of India's first lithium-ion cell manufacturing facility at Tirupati, Andhra Pradesh. Currently, India imports complete requirements of lithium-ion cells primarily from China, South Korea, Vietnam, and Hong Kong.**
- 85. Army chief General Manoj Pandey inaugurates Kargil International Marathon: General Manoj Pandey has inaugurated Kargil International Marathon in Ladakh. The events are organized by the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC), Kargil, and Ladakh police in collaboration with Sarhad Pune. The events include runs of full length, Half, 10 km, and 5 km. In the International Marathon, over 2000 runners participated. General Manoj Pande, PVSM, AVSM, VSM, ADC is an Indian Army General serving as the 29th and the current Chief of the Army Staff.**
- 86. Maharashtra's Daulatabad Fort to be renamed as 'Devgiri' Fort:** Maharashtra Tourism Ministry has decided to rename the Daulatabad fort to Devgiri which is located near Aurangabad. This decision comes after Shiv Sena Chief Uddhav Thackeray. It is a national heritage monument, which is maintained by the Archeological Survey of India (ASI). Daulatpur Fort is a historic fortified citadel located in Devagiri Village near Aurangabad, Maharashtra. It was earlier the capital of the Yadava Dynasty for a brief time the capital of the Delhi Sultanate.
- 87. Saffron from Kashmir GI-tagged on sites both domestic and abroad:** Saffron from Kashmir GI-tagged: Farmers in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir are now able to sell their products on

- 88. Gujarati film 'Chhello Show' becomes India's official entry for Oscars 2023:** Gujarati film "Chhello Show", a coming-of-age drama about a young boy's love affair with cinema in a village in Saurashtra, is India's official entry for the 95th Academy Awards or Oscar awards, the Film Federation of India (FFI) announced. Titled "Last Film Show" in English, the Pan Nalin directorial will release in theatres countrywide on October 14. The 95th Academy Awards are scheduled to take place on March 12, 2023 in Los Angeles. Last year, Tamil drama "Koozhangal" ("Pebbles"), directed by filmmaker Vinothraj PS, was India's official entry at the Oscars but didn't make the shortlist. The last Indian film that made it to the final five was the Aamir Khan-led "Lagaan" in 2001
- 89. India's Presidency of AIBD extended for one more year:** India's Presidency of the Asia-Pacific Institute of Broadcasting Development (AIBD), has been extended for one more year. The Chief Executive Officer of Prasar Bharati and Director General of Doordarshan Mayank Kumar Agrawal is the President of AIBD. The decision to extend AIBD was taken at the two-day General Conference of the AIBD held in New Delhi. The conference was inaugurated by the Union Minister for Information and Broadcasting Anurag Thakur. AIBD stands for Asia Pacific Institute for Broadcasting Development. The AIBD was formed in the year 1977. It is an inter-governmental organization of the Union Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific. AIBD works in the field of electronic media development and currently has 26 countries as complete members represented by 43 organizations and 52 affiliate members.
- 90. Maharashtra to establish an institution similar to NITI Aayog: Maharashtra:** The state's deputy chief minister, Devendra Fadnavis, revealed in a meeting that the Maharashtra government intends to create an organisation along the lines of Niti Aayog. In 2015, the BJP government dismissed the five-year plan framework and established the Niti Aayog think tank to stimulate economic growth through improved policymaking. The national government's top think tank for public policy, NITI Aayog, is tasked with developing concepts and identifying important areas for policy making.
- 91. RBI Governor Launches 3 key Digital Payment Initiatives at Global Fintech Fest 2022:** The three digital payment initiatives that were launched by the RBI are RuPay Credit Card on Unified Payments Interface (UPI), UPI Lite, and Bharat BillPay Cross-Border Bill Payments. UPI Lite will provide users with a convenient solution for faster and simpler low-value transactions, the National Payments Corp Of India (NPCI) said in a statement. Now that UPI Lite on BHIM App will be enabled, the users will be able to make small-value transactions in a near-offline mode. The upper limit of a UPI Lite payment transaction will be ₹200. The total limit of the UPI Lite digital payment mode on the wallet on a device would be ₹2,000 at any point in time. RuPay Credit Card on UPI and Bharat BillPay Cross-Border Bill Payments were also launched that are likely to make bill payments easier for people residing out of India but also maintaining a house in India.

PM CARES Fund: Govt appoints Industrialist Ratan Tata as Trustee:** Veteran industrialist Ratan Tata, former Supreme Court judge KT Thomas, and former deputy Lok Sabha speaker Kariya Munda have been nominated as trustees of the PM CARES Fund. Prime Minister Narendra Modi chaired a meeting of the Board of Trustees of the PM CARES Fund. The PM CARES Fund was created during the Covid-19 pandemic. The primary objective of the fund is to deal with any kind of emergency or distress situation, like posed by the pandemic, and to provide relief to the affected individuals.
- 93. Gol named Bharat Lal as new DG of National Centre for Good Governance:** Retired Gujarat cadre officer, Bharat Lal has been appointed as the Director General, National Centre for Good Governance (NCGG). Bharat Lal, a 1988-batch Indian Forest officer of Gujarat cadre, had served as Gujarat government's resident commissioner in Delhi and has been known to be close to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the then chief minister of the state. Earlier, during December 2021, Lal was appointed as the Secretary to the Lokpal. The National Centre for Good Governance (NCGG) is an autonomous institute under the aegis of the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, Government of India. Its head office is at New Delhi and the branch office at Mussoorie.
- 94. Nation gets its first Dugong Conservation Reserve in Tamil Nadu:** Tamil Nadu has notified the country's first 'Dugong Conservation Reserve' in Palk Bay covering the coastal waters of Thanjavur and Pudukottai districts with an area of 448 square kilometres. In September 2021 Government of Tamil Nadu (GoTN) initiated the idea of the 'Dugong Conservation Reserve' to be established in the Palk Bay region, in order to protect the endangered Dugong species and its marine habitats in Tamil Nadu. At present, there are around 240 Dugongs in India and a majority of them are found in the Tamil Nadu Coast (Palk Bay region).
- 95. 19) REC Ltd becomes 12th company to gets 'Maharatna' company status :** Power sector-focussed non-banking finance company (NBFC) REC Ltd. has been accorded the status of a 'Maharatna' Central Public Sector Enterprise, thus providing it with greater operational and financial autonomy. The granting of 'Maharatna' status will impart enhanced powers to the company's board while taking financial decisions. REC Ltd. is the 12th company to be given the Maharatna Status. Introduced in 2010, the Maharatna status is given to the Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSE) by the Central Government to make these enterprises global giants. This status is granted to CPSE which recorded more than Rs. 5,000 crores of net profit for three consecutive years, an average annual turnover of Rs.25,000 crore for three years and recording an average net worth of Rs.15,000 crore for three years.
- 96. UCO Bank becomes first lender to get RBI's approval for rupee trade:** UCO Bank has received the approval of the Reserve Bank of India to open a special Vostro account with Gazprom Bank of Russia for trade settlement in Indian rupees. UCO Bank which is a Kolkata-based lender is the first bank to receive the regulator's approval following the decision of RBI to allow Indian Banks to settle trade in Indian currency in July. UCO Bank was formerly known as United Commercial Bank which

Indian Women's rights activist Srishti Bakshi wins 'Changemaker' award:** A women's rights activist from India, Srishti Bakshi has won the 'Changemaker' award at the UN SDG (United Nations Sustainable Development Goals) Action Awards held at a ceremony in Bonn, Germany. The award is given to recognise the efforts of Srishti Bakshi to raise awareness of gender-based violence and inequality. Srishti Bakshi, a marketer-turned-women's-rights-activist and founder of the CrossBow Miles movement, started on an on-foot pilgrimage of 3,800 Km through 12 Indian states from Kanyakumari to Kashmir. She has covered a distance of 30-35 km and met anywhere between 150-200 people a day.
- 141. India celebrates 118th birth anniversary of Lal Bahadur Shastri: India celebrates the 118th birth anniversary of Lal Bahadur Shastri,** the nation's second Prime Minister. Shastri, who succeeded Jawaharlal Nehru, was respected for his forthrightness and honesty, and after his passing, he was awarded the Bharat Ratna, making him the first posthumous laureate of this prestigious award. Shastri has the same birthday (2 October) as Mahatma Gandhi even though he was born in 1904, 35 years later. He is also remembered for composing the slogan of "Jai Jawan, Jai Kisan". Shastri died on January 11, 1966, in Tashkent, Uzbekistan, just a day after the peace treaty was signed for the end of the 1965 Indo-Pakistan War.
- 142. International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons 2022:** The United Nations observes 26 September every year as the International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons. The aim of the day is to enhance public awareness about the threat posed to humanity by nuclear weapons and the necessity for their total elimination.
