- 1. Gandhi Jayanti 2023: Gandhi Jayanti, celebrated on October 2nd every year, is a day of profound significance in India and around the world. It marks the 154th birth anniversary of Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi, fondly known as Mahatma Gandhi, Bapu or the Father of the Nation. Ek Tareekh Ek Ghanta Ek Saath" is the theme for 2 October Gandhi Jayanti, A national call to action for 1 Hour of citizen-led shramdaan for swachhata on 1st Oct, 2023 at 10 am.
- 2. Lal Bahadur Shastri Jayanti 2023: 2nd October 2023 marks the 119th birth anniversary of Lal Bahadur Shastri, India's second Prime Minister. One of Lal Bahadur Shastri's enduring legacies is the slogan "Jai Jawan Jai Kisan,"
- 3. J&K Achieves 100% Open Defecation Free Plus Model Status: All villages within the union territory of Jammu and Kashmir have attained the status of being Open Defecation-Free (ODF) Plus Model as part of the Swachh Bharat Mission.
- 4. Pro-China Leader Mohamed Muizzu Wins Maldives Presidential Election: Mohamed Muizzu, a pro-China candidate from the Progressive Party of Maldives (PPM), won the Maldives presidential election with over 53% of the vote in a runoff. Muizzu sl defeated incumbent president, Ibrahim Solih.
- 5. Hottest Place in India: Sri Ganganagr is renowned as the hottest place in India due to its scorching summer temperatures, which regularly soar above 45 degree Celsius (115 degree Fahrenheit). Sri Ganganagar, situated in the northernmost region of the Indian state of Rajasthan, serves as an evident to human determination and creativity in the midst of challenging desert surroundings. Famed as the hottest place in India, this city boasts a storied past, a lively cultural scene and a prosperous agricultural sector that has transformed this formerly parched terrain into the "Agricultural Hub of Rajasthan."
- 6. Tallest Statue Of B.R. Ambedkar To Be Unveiled In North America On October 14: The tallest statue of the 'Architect of the Indian Constitution,' B.R. Ambedkar, known as the 'Statue of Equality,' is set to be unveiled in Maryland on October 14. - 8. Jammu And Kashmir's Renowned Pashmina Craft Receives Gl Tag: Basohli Pashmina, a renowned traditional craft from the Kathua district of Jammu and Kashmir, has recently been awarded the prestigious Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- 9. Father of Blue Revolution: Dr. Hiralal Chaudhari, a visionary in the field of fisheries, played a pivotal role in revolutionizing fish production in India. His pioneering work in induced breeding and fish farming techniques was instrumental in driving this transformation. He is widely recognized as the "Father of the Blue Revolution" and his innovative research and contributions have left a lasting impact, not only on India's fisheries industry but also on a global scale.

- 10. Operation Ajay set to evacuate Indian nationals from Israel: India has launched Operation Ajay, a dedicated initiative to facilitate the safe return of its citizens from Israel amidst the ongoing developments in the region.
- 11. U 20: Urban 20 or U20 is a city diplomacy initiative, comprising of cities from G20 countries. It strives to establish a lasting practice of engagement among cities to develop a collective message that emphasizes the role of cities in taking forward the sustainable development agenda. U20 is an engagement group under the larger intergovernmental forum of G20 and plays a vital role in contributing perspectives, concerns, and ideas from cities to inform and enrich the overall G20 negotiations.
- 12. Udaipur Set To Become India's First Wetland City: The Rajasthan government, in collaboration with the Environment and Forest Department, is making concerted efforts to elevate Udaipur, also known as the 'City of Lakes,' to international prominence by aiming to become India's first wetland city. Presently, there are 42 wetland cities situated across 17 nations around the world, with China boasting the highest number, with 13 such cities.
- 13. Global Hunger Index 2023: India's Decline to 111th Place: India has been placed at the 111th position out of 125 countries in the Global Hunger Index (GHI) for 2023, marking a decline from its 107th position in 2022. In comparison to neighboring countries, India's GHI ranking appears stark: India: 111th; Pakistan: 102nd; Bangladesh: 81st; Nepal: 69th; Sri Lanka: 60th. In the Global Hunger Index (GHI) of 2023, Belarus, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Chile, China, and Croatia have emerged as the top-performing countries. Chad, Niger, Lesotho, Congo, Yemen, Madagascar, and the Central African Republic find themselves at the bottom of the GHI rankings for 2023.

The song, which celebrates the splendour of the Navratri festival and the vibrant traditions of Gujarat, was penned by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
- 20. First Woman Speaker of Lok Sabha: In 2009, Meira Kumar created a historic milestone as she become the first female speaker of Lok Sabha. With a remarkable political career, Kumar emerged as a powerful champion for inclusiveness and women's rights. Her tenure in the 15th Lok Sabha, spanning from 2009 to 2014, represented a pivotal juncture in advancing gender equality within the parliamentary processes of India. Before entering politics, she served as a diplomat in the Indian Foreign Service (IFS). She played a role in fostering international relations, representing India's interests abroad.
- 21. Uttar Pradesh Government's 'Swachch Tyohar, Swasth Tyohar' Campaign: The Yogi Adityanath government in Uttar Pradesh has launched a special cleanliness campaign, 'Swachch Tyohar, Swasth Tyohar' (Clean Festival, Healthy Festival), with a focus on maintaining cleanliness in and around temples during Navratri, Dussehra, and Diwali festivals. This initiative aims to promote the idea that 'Cleanliness is next to Godliness' and calls for active participation from municipal bodies and citizens.
- 22. PM Modi directs ISRO to land on the moon by 2040: India's Prime Minister, Narendra Modi, has announced ambitious plans to expand the country's space activities, including sending its first astronaut to the moon by 2040 and establishing a native space station by 2035. Originally, India aimed to have its own space station by 2022, but technical issues and the COVID-19 pandemic caused delays. The Gaganyaan mission, expected in 2025, plans to launch three crew members into orbit for three days. India's space sector opened up to private companies in 2020, leading to the growth of over 150 space tech startups and increased foreign investments.
- 23. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh Launches Project 'Udbhav' To Promote "Indianisation": The Indian Army recently launched 'Project Udbhav' with the aim of rediscovering the profound Indian heritage of statecraft and strategic thoughts derived from ancient Indian texts. "Project Udbhav, initiated by the military, aims to tap into ancient Indian treatises such as Chanakya's Arthashastra, Kamandaka's Nitisara, and the Thirukkural by the Tamil poet-saint Thiruvalluvar to glean insights on statecraft, strategy, diplomacy, and warfare.

- **24. First Female Train Driver in India:** Surekha Yadav is the first woman from India to become a train driver and also a train driver of indigenously designed train "Vande Bharat Express".
- 25. ISRO's Gaganyaan Test Missions TV-D1: A Historical Milestone: India's Gaganyaan project, marked by the recent successful TV-D1 test flight, reflects the nation's ascent in space exploration. The recent test flight of Gaganyaan mission TV-D1 served as a crucial milestone in the project. It was designed to evaluate the performance of drogue parachutes in stabilizing the spacecraft and decelerating it during reentry into Earth's atmosphere.
- 26. Pink City of India: Jaipur, often referred to as the "Pink City of India," is a captivating city nestled in the beautiful region of Rajasthan, India. This city boasts a rich cultural heritage and a strong identity. Jaipur, an enchanting city located in the Indian state of Rajasthan, is famously known as the "Pink City of India." Established in 1727 by Rawal Jodhaji, it soon became the capital of Rajasthan and gained recognition for its rich history and unique charm. Its buildings, painted in stunning pastel shades of pink, earned its nickname "Pink City," a label bestowed upon it by the British for their striking beauty. One of the most popular theories behind the city's pink hue is that in 1876, Maharaj Sawai Ram Singh II had the entire city painted pink to welcome Prince Albert of England. Pink was chosen as it symbolized hospitality and this gesture was meant to strengthen political and diplomatic ties with the British. Legend has it that when Price Albert saw the city's pink transformation, he referred it as the "Pink City," and the nickname stuck. This association with royalty added to the city's charm and fame. Jaipur offers many tourist attractions, some of them are: Hawa Mahal: A world heritage monument known for its romantic charm. It was built in the 17th century by Wazir of Amber, Nawab Kelach Khan Sur. Jaigarh Fort: A historic fort offering panoramic views. Jantar-Mantar: An astronomical observatory filled with fascinating instruments.
- 27. Mumbai second most polluted major global city as air quality worsens: India is grappling with severe air pollution issues, with Mumbai ranking as the second most polluted city according to IQAir, a leading air quality measurement company. Delhi, the capital, also faces significant air quality challenges, ranking sixth globally. The air quality index (AQI) measures pollution levels, indicating the health risks associated with breathing the air. A study published in The Lancet revealed that around 1.6 million deaths in India in 2019 were attributed to air pollution. The economic toll was staggering, amounting to billions of dollars in losses, with premature deaths accounting for \$28.8 billion and morbidity adding \$8 billion to the burden. Uttar Pradesh suffered the highest economic loss at \$5.1 billion due to air pollution, followed by Maharashtra (\$4 billion), Gujarat (\$2.9 billion), Karnataka (\$2.7 billion), and Tamil Nadu (\$2.5 billion). Delhi experienced the highest per-capita economic loss, underscoring the severity of the crisis. In South Asia, India witnessed a drastic 54.8% increase in particulate matter between 2000 and 2021, indicating a worsening trend. Bangladesh, Afghanistan, and Pakistan also faced significant rises in pollution levels during this period.
- 28. Cyclone 'Hamoon' Weakens into Deep Depression Over Bangladesh and Mizoram: Cyclone Hamoon, a severe weather phenomenon, struck the southeastern coast of Bangladesh on the 25th

October 2023, causing widespread concern and necessitating the evacuation of thousands of people. Cyclone 'Hamoon' was named by Iran. 'Hamoon' is a Persian term signifying temporary desert lakes and marshlands that naturally form in region near the Helmand basin. These areas serve as seasonal water reservoirs. In a related weather development, the Severe Cyclonic Storm 'TEJ' over coastal Yemen has weakened into a cyclonic storm. It is expected to move west-northwestwards and weaken further into a depression over the next six hours.

- 29. UPSC Chairman: Dr. Manoj Soni assumed the role of Chairman of UPSC succeeding his predecessor, Pradeep Kumar Joshi.
- 30. SEBI Chairman: The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has played a pivotal role in molding and supervising India's securities and commodities market ever since its establishment on April 12, 1988. The evolution of SEBI, transitioning from an executive body to a regulatory authority with legal authority in 1992

38. Nobel Prize 2023 Winners List: The Nobel Prize is the world's most prestigious award, honoring individuals and organizations for outstanding achievements in physics, chemistry, medicine, literature, peace, and economics. The prizes are awarded annually by the Nobel Foundation, based on the will of Swedish industrialist and inventor Alfred Nobel. The Nobel Prize amount for 2023 is set at Swedish kronor (SEK) 11.0 million per full Nobel Prize.

39. Hamas, the Palestinian militant group: In October 2023, Hamas, an Islamist militant group governing the Gaza Strip, launched a massive surprise attack on southern Israel, killing hundreds of civilians and soldiers and taking dozens as hostages. This unprecedented assault has led to a significant escalation

in the conflict between Israel and Hamas. Hamas, short for Harakat al-Muqawama al-Islamiya (Islamic Resistance Movement), was founded in 1987 by Sheikh Ahmed Yassin, a Palestinian cleric with ties to the Muslim Brotherhood. Hamas faces financial challenges due to its designation as a terrorist organization by several countries. Historically, it received funding from Palestinian expatriates and private donors, as well as some Islamic charities. Qatar has provided financial assistance, while Iran is a significant benefactor, contributing funds, weapons, and training. Turkey has been accused of funding Hamas, and it has also received foreign aid via the Palestinian Authority and UN agencies. Since Israel's withdrawal from Gaza in 2005, Hamas has been the de facto authority in the territory. It won a majority in the PA's legislature in 2006 and established its government. It gained popularity for the social services it provided and as a rejection of Fatah's perceived corruption. Hamas's 2023 assault on Israel, "Operation Al-Aqsa Storm," was unprecedented in its strategy, scale, and secrecy. It involved launching thousands of rockets into Israel, breaching the Gaza border, and infiltrating Israeli towns. This attack was a response to Israel's blockade of Gaza, its occupation of Palestinian lands, and alleged crimes against Muslims, including the desecration of Al-Aqsa Mosque in Jerusalem.

- 40. Israel Capital, Flag, Map and Currency: Israel Capital, Flag, Map and Currency. The capital of Israel is Jerusalem. It holds immense historical and religious significance as a holy city for Judaism, Christianity and Islam. Israel officially declared Jerusalem as its capital in 1980. The flag of Israel was officially adopted on 28th October 1948, shortly after the establishment of the nation. The national anthem of Israel is "Hatikvah" (The Hope). The currency of Israel is the Israeli new shekel, coded as ILS. It was previously known as the New Israeli Sheqel (NIS). The shekel is symbolized by 回, a combination of two Hebrew words: shekel and hadash. Israel is situated in the eastern part of the Mediterranean region. It shares borders with several countries: Lebanon to the north; Syria to the northeast; Jordan to the east; Egypt to the southwest; Palestinian territories to the east and west
- 41. 1st P20 Summit under India's G20 Presidency Concludes: The first ever G20 Parliamentary Speakers' Summit (P20 Summit) hosted by the world's largest democracy concluded at India International Convention Centre, Yashobhoomi, Dwarka, Delhi today, October 14, 2023, with parliamentarians from across the world coming together and reaffirming their commitment to continue their joint work to make an effective and meaningful parliamentary contribution to the G20 process.
- 42. Sheikh Hasina unveils largest project built with Chinese aid: Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina marked a historic moment in the country's infrastructure development by inaugurating the 82-km Padma Bridge Rail Link. This significant project, executed under China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), is poised to transform Bangladesh's connectivity and economic landscape.
- 43. Putin in Kyrgystan for first trip abroad since ICC arrest warrant: Russian President Vladimir Putin embarked on his first foreign trip since the International Criminal Court (ICC) issued an arrest warrant for him in March, raising international attention and scrutiny. The visit took place in Kyrgyzstan, a Central Asian nation historically tied to Moscow. During his meeting with Kyrgyz President Sadyr

- Japarov, Putin emphasized Russia's significance as Kyrgyzstan's top trade partner and largest investor, reaffirming their commitment to mutual cooperation.
- 44. International Cricket Council: The International Cricket Council (ICC) is the world governing body of cricket. It was founded as the Imperial Cricket Conference in 1909 by representatives from Australia, England and South Africa. It was renamed as the International Cricket Conference in 1965, and took up its current name in 1987. It has its headquarters in Dubai, UAE. It has 108 member nations currently.
- <u>45.</u> United Nations Day 2023 celebrates on 24 October: United Nations Day, observed on October 24th each year, commemorates the anniversary of the entry into force of the UN Charter in 1945.

- 46. Lt General Raghu Srinivasan As New BRO Chief: Lieutenant General Raghu Srinivasan took on the position of the 28th Director General (DG) of the Border Roads Organisation (BRO) after Lt Gen Rajeev Chaudhry retired. The Border Roads Organisation was established on May 7, 1960, with the primary objective of securing India's borders through the development of infrastructure in the remote regions of the north and northeast.
- <u>47.</u> Justice Siddharth Mridul appointed as the chief justice of Manipur High Court: Justice Siddharth Mridul was appointed as the chief justice of Manipur High Court three months after the Supreme Court Collegium recommendation.
