DATES & DAYS

- **April 2:- World Autism Awareness Day.** United Nations General Assembly designated 2 April as World Autism Awareness Day (WAAD) in 2007. Theme:- "Advancing Neurodiversity and the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)".
- **April 4:- International Day for Mine Awareness.** On 8 December 2005, the UN General Assembly declared 4 April as the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action. Theme :- "Safe Futures Start Here."
- **April 5:- National Maritime Day.** Indian celebrates 62nd Maritime day in 2025. The day was observed as a tribute to the maiden voyage of the first Indian-owned ship, SS Loyalty (of the Scindia Steam Navigation Company Ltd) from Mumbai to London on 5th April 1919. First observed in 1964.
- **6 April:- International Day of Sports For Development And Peace.** Theme:- Leveling the Playing Field: Sport for Social Inclusion
- **7 April:- World Health Day.** The campaign of 2025, titled Healthy beginnings, hopeful futures. 7 April marks the anniversary of the founding of WHO in 1948.
- **April 10:- World Homeopathy Day 2025.** The day is observed on the occasion of the birth anniversary of German physician Dr . Christian Friedrich Samuel Hahnemann, the founder of homoeopathy. Theme of the convention is 'अध्ययन , अध्यापन एवं अनुसंधान', Organisers :- Under the aegis of the Ministry of AYUSH.
- **11 April - World Parkinson's Day.** In April 1997, the inaugural World Parkinson's Day (WPD) was established by the European Association for Parkinson's Disease (now known as Parkinson's Europe) and co-sponsored by the World Health Organization (WHO). James Parkinson's 'Essay on the Shaking Palsy', published in 1817, recognised Parkinson's as a medical condition for the first time. This date marks Dr. James Parkinson's birthday.
- **18 April- World Heritage Day (International Day for Monuments and Sites).** Celebrated to honour and protect cultural and natural heritage. The International Council on Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS) proposed the idea of observing World Heritage Day, in 1982 . It was approved by the 22nd UNESCO General Conference in 1983. Theme :- "Heritage under Threat from Disasters and Conflicts: Preparedness and Learning from 60 years of ICOMOS Actions."
- **17 April- World Haemophilia Day.** World Haemophilia Day was first celebrated on the 17th of April 1989, by the World Federation of Haemophilia (WFH) to honour Frank Schnabel's birthday, the WFH's founder. Theme :- "Access for All: Women and Girls Bleed Too".

- **22 April- World Earth Day.** Theme :- OUR POWER, OUR PLANET. The first World Earth Day was held on April 22, 1970, in the United States.
- **24 April- National Panchayati Raj Day.** The first celebrated in 2010. The main function will be organized in the presence of PM Modi, at Lohna Uttar Gram Panchayat, Jhanjharpur Block in Madhubani District of Bihar. The Prime Minister will confer Special Category National Panchayat Awards 2025 on this occasion.
- **April 25- World Malaria Day.** It was instituted by WHO Member States during the World Health Assembly of 2007. THEME: Malaria Ends with Us: Reinvest, Reimagine, Reignite.

- Shirley Botchwey becomes 1st African woman to assume office as Commonwealth Secretary-General, Current Members:--56 members (including India).
- Sivasubramanian Ramann Appointed as New Chairperson of PFRDA, statutory regulatory body set up under the PFRDA Act enacted in 2014.
- The central government announced the appointment of Dr Poonam Gupta, Director General, National Council of Applied Economic Research, New Delhi to the post of Deputy Governor, Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for a three-year term.
- N. Chandrasekaran, the Chairman of Tata Sons, has been appointed as a member of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) Managing Director's Advisory Council on Entrepreneurship and Growth.

- Forest fires that had erupted in several parts of Mizoram's Phawngpui National Park have affected nearly one-ninth of the park's total area.
- India becomes 4th nation having capabilities to shoot down fixed wing drone by laser beam.
- Prime Minister Modi lays foundation stone of Madhav Netralaya Premium Centre in Nagpur, Maharashtra.
- 7th Pay Commission DA Hike: The Union Cabinet, headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved a 2 per cent DA hike.
- The Cabinet has approved the inclusion of Bihar's Kosi Mechi Intra-State Link Project under the Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchai Yojana-Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme (PMKSY-AIBP) to enhance irrigation and flood management in the region. India has launched Operation Brahma, sending humanitarian aid and relief supplies to the affected region.
- Centre extends AFSPA in parts of Manipur, Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh for six months. Armed Forces (Special) Powers Act is a law enacted by the Parliament in 1958 which gives the armed forces special powers and immunity to maintain public order in "disturbed areas".
- The Karimpuzha Wildlife Sanctuary, Kerala's youngest protected area, has emerged as a biodiversity hotspot.
- Kasampatty sacred grove in Dindigul declared Tamil Nadu's second biodiversity heritage site. Biological Diversity Act, 2002.
- Famous Saudagari block print, prepared by the artisans of Jamalpur in Ahmedabad, Gujarat.
- 90th Anniversary of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) established on April 1, 1935, following the recommendations of the Hilton Young Commission. It was established in accordance with the provisions of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934. It was originally set up as a private entity in 1935, but it was nationalized in 1949. First Governor - Sir Osborne Smith.
- The tribal communities of Jharkhand and Chhotanagpur region are celebrating Sarhul. Sarhul literally means 'worship of the Sal tree' and marks the onset of spring and the Adivasi New Year.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi will embark on a two-day visit to Thailand on the 3rd of April to participate in the 6th BIMSTEC Summit. Theme of the 6th BIMSTEC Summit is "Prosperous, Resilient, and Open BIMSTEC. 5th Summit in Colombo (which was conducted virtually in 2022)
- Sagarmala Programme Completes 10 Years Since Implementation. Launched in March 2015, is the flagship initiative of the Ministry of Ports, Shipping, and Waterways.
- National Statistics Office (NSO) released the Energy Statistics India 2025, detailing energy production, consumption, and import trends for FY 2023–24. The data shows India's strong energy recovery post-COVID and reflects efforts toward Viksit Bharat 2047 vision.
- ICAR-Central Tuber Crops Research Institute (ICAR-CTCRI) developed an orange-fleshed sweet potato (SP-95/4) to improve tribal food security in Kerala and other states.
- Odisha has recorded its first-ever international export of drumstick (moringa) from the Rayagada district and pointed gourd (parwal) to Dubai.
- Researchers have developed a method using bacteria to repair bricks used to build structures on the Moon that can develop cracks due to the widely swinging temperatures on the lunar surface.

- Hungary's government has announced its withdrawal from the International Criminal Court (ICC), just before Prime Minister Viktor Orban received his Israeli counterpart, Benjamin Netanyahu, who faces an ICC arrest warrant.
- The Nomad Capitalist Passport Index 2025 compiled by the international tax and immigration firm Nomad Capitalist evaluates 199 nationals ; Ireland has claimed the top spot, second place are Switzerland and Greece ; India on 148th, tied with Comoros Afghanistan is ranked at the very bottom.
- India ranks 36 out of 170 nations on 'Readiness for Frontier Technologies' Index Technology and Innovation Report, issued by UN Trade and Development (UNCTAD), India improved its position from 48th in 2022.
- The five-day Madhavpur Ghed fair began at Madhavpur in the Porbandar district of Gujarat.
- 6th BIMSTEC Summit held in Bangkok, Thailand. Theme was "BIMSTEC: Prosperous, Resilient, and Open". Bangladesh assumes Chairmanship of BIMSTEC for next two years.
- Delhi became the 35th State/UT to implement the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY). AB PM-JAY will provides free health cover of Rs. 5 Lakh to each beneficiary family per year.
- Brazil has proposed the creation of "Climate Change Council" a new international body to accelerate global climate action, under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).
- India overtakes Germany to become 3rd-largest generator of wind, solar power in 2024: Report ; sixth edition of global energy think tank Ember's Global Electricity Review
- President Droupadi Murmu Holds Talks in Lisbon, Launches Stamp to Mark 50 Years of India-Portugal Ties.
- Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami launched the Bhagirath mobile app based on the Jal Sanrakshan Abhiyan 2025 theme, "Dhara Mera, Naula Mera, Gaon Mera, Prayas Mera", and released the brochure. Through this app, people will be able to share information about critical and endangered water sources in their area.
- Mysuru-based CSIR-Central Food Technological Research Institute (CFTRI) has developed a technology, which is aimed at supporting the floriculture sector under the CSIR's Floriculture

- Karnataka-based writer, activist and lawyer Banu Mushtaq's short story collection 'Heart Lamp', translated from Kannada to English by Deepa Bhashti, was shortlisted for the International Booker Prize 2025 in London.
- Meghalaya's Ryndia earn GI tag for indigenous textiles.
- Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini announced a 10% hike in reservation for Agniveers in state police jobs, taking the total reservation to 20%.
- The Investigation, Prosecution and Conviction Portal, of the Uttar Pradesh Police was honoured with the SKOCH Award at national level in the "Police & Safety" category.
- BatEchoMon, India's first automated bat monitoring, detection system
- Bangladesh has officially become the 54th nation to sign the Artemis Accords. The Artemis Accords are a series of non-binding multilateral arrangements between the United States government and other world governments that elaborates on the norms expected to be followed in outer space. Artemis Accords were established in 2020 by the United States, led by NASA and the U.S.
- 9th edition of the Global Technology Summit (GTS) 2025 will be held in New Delhi. Theme - Sambhavna – meaning possibilities.
- Indian Institute of Management-Ahmedabad to open campus in Dubai . Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum (Crown Prince of Dubai and Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defence of the UAE) was on his first official visit to India from 8 - 9 April 2025.
- Ladakh celebrates Apricot Blossom Festival 2025 to boost eco-tourism.
- Mauritius is the first country in the Africa region, and the fourth country globally after Bangladesh, Bhutan, and Cuba to sign the CPF with International Solar Alliance (ISA).
- Foundation stone for India's first Gallium Nitride (GaN)-based semiconductor manufacturing plant was laid in Nava Raipur.
- Punjab: Milkfed launches 'Veera' mascot for Verka to boost brand nationwide.
- Puthandu, or Tamil New Year, marks the first day of the Tamil solar calendar and is a significant occasion for Tamils worldwide. Celebrated as the first day of the Tamil month of Chittirai.
- PM Modi lays foundation stones, dedicates development projects worth ₹10,000 Cr in Haryana. He laid the foundation stone for the third unit of 800 MW at Deenbandhu Chhotu Ram Thermal Power Plant in Yamunanagar worth Rs.8,469 crore.
- Additionally, he laid the foundation stone for a GOBARdhan Plant in Yamunanagar worth Rs.90 crore (to be developed in collaboration with BPCL) and inaugurated the Rewari Bypass - four-lane bypass has been constructed around Rewari city to reduce traffic congestion.
- The Telangana government has declared heatwaves, sunstrokes, and sunburns as a 'State-Specific Disaster'. It has also enhanced the financial relief provided to families of heatwave victims to ₹4 lakh per deceased person.

- The Telangana government has notified the implementation of the Telangana Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Act 2025. The State has issued a gazette notification with April 14, 2025 as the appointed day for categorisation of Scheduled Castes (SC) into three groups.
- India Justice Report (IJR) 2025: Not a single State/UT meets their own reserved quotas for women in police force. Uttar Pradesh: Has the most overcrowded prisons. Over 50% of High Court judges' positions remain vacant. Delhi :- 91% of the prison population are undertrials, the highest in the country. Has the best officer-to-inmate ratio (22 inmates per officer) among large States. Karnataka is the only State that met quotas in both Police and Judiciary. Bihar:- has the highest share of women in State police.
- New York City declares April 14 as Dr B.R. Ambedkar Day
- Amit Shah attends CRPF 86th raising day Parade. CRPF's Raising Day is celebrated on March 19 every year. However, as part of the extended celebrations this year, the parade was held in Neemuch, Madhya Pradesh on April 17. Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) functions under the authority of the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA). Originally constituted as the Crown Representative Police in 1939, it is one of the oldest Central para military forces (now termed as Central Armed Police Force). It became the Central Reserve Police Force on enactment of the CRPF Act on 28th December 1949.
- The Indian Institute of Spices Research (IISR), Kozhikode, has developed a new light-coloured turmeric variety - IISR Surya.
- Cheetah Project Steering Committee officially approved the relocation of some cheetahs from Kuno National Park to Gandhi Sagar Wildlife Sanctuary in Madhya Pradesh.
- The manuscripts of the Bhagavad Gita and Bharat Muni's Natyashastra have been added to UNESCO's Memory of the World Register.
- PM Modi's book on Indian culture Sanskriti Ka Paanchva Adhyay released in New Delhi.
- CRPF to raise 11th CoBRA battalion for counter-terror operations in J&K.
- The Maharashtra State Wildlife Board has officially approved the declaration of DPS Flamingo Lake as a conservation reserve, making it the first wetland connected to the Thane Creek Flamingo Sanctuary (TCFS) to receive such protection.
- Hindi made compulsory as 3rd language in Maharashtra Schools under NEP 2020.
- The World's Best Hospitals 2024 report was released by the American Media company Newsweek in partnership with global data platform Statista. Mayo Clinic in Minnesota, United States, with a score of 97.51%, was named the Best hospital in the world. All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi, has been ranked as the best hospital in India and 97th in the world.
- QpiAI announces India's most powerful quantum computer, code-named Indus Quantum Computer.
- India's first satellite, Aryabhata, completed 50 years on April 19. Launched on this day in 1975, the satellite was named after the ancient Indian mathematician and astronomer, Aryabhata.
- IAF's Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla to Fly to ISS Next Month on Axiom's Ax-4 Mission.
- The Gujarat government has announced a reduction in the motor vehicle tax rate on electric vehicles from the existing 6 percent to only 1 percent, offering a 5 percent rebate. The decision has been made to boost electric vehicle adoption, protect the environment, and promote the tourism sector.

- Indigenously developed (Human papillomavirus) HPV test kits for cervical cancer screening have been developed under the Department of Biotechnology's (DBT) partnership programme Grand Challenges India (GCI) at the Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC).
